

MEDICAL FORM

Our Medical Form is a 1 page, 2- sided form that fulfills both BSA and State requirements. The parent/guardian completes sections A and B. Sections C and D must be completed by the Physician. A school medical form may be attached in place of Section C. Please read the medical form carefully and follow the directions.

ALL youth **MUST** have an updated medical form, signed by a parent or guardian yearly, along with a medical evaluation completed by a licensed physician within 3 years prior to check in day.

Adults **MUST** have a current physician's evaluation, within 1 year if 40 or older, within 3 years if under 40 years of age.

No physicals will be given at camp.

For ALL youth and adults attending resident camp programs at Camp Strang, the form must be given to the Troop/Unit Leader prior to the pre-camp meeting for prescreening and preventing last minute problems upon arrival at camp. This policy also applies to temporary leadership.

For ALL youth attending Cub Scout Day Camp, the medical form must be submitted with the registration form and payment **at least** a week prior to the start of camp. ALL volunteers **must** also fill out the medical form and turn it into the Health Officer.

Medical forms will not be returned. Prior to summer camp, parents/guardians should make copies of the medical form. No one will be allowed to stay at camp without the properly completed form.

ALLERGIES

Please make sure that the Camp Director and Camp Health Officer are aware of ANY allergies you son may have, especially food, nut, bee sting allergies.

MEDICATIONS

All medications for Scouts and Scouters must be turned into the camp Health Officer during check-in, prior to scouts participating in any activities. All Scouts must also have a **school photo** accompanying their medications. Only legal medications will be given to a Scout during the week, meaning that each form of medication **MUST** have a date as well as a doctor's name on the container.

Medications must be in the original container!

Non-prescription, over the counter medication must also be left with the Health Officer. **This is a state law.**

Medications at Camp Strang can be picked up at the Health Lodge on Saturday, prior to the Court of Honor. Medications at Cub Day Camp can be picked up from the Health Officer during the Friday Family Picnic. Any medications not picked up, will be sent to the Council Office and held there **for 2 weeks after the end of camp**. If no one picks them up within those 2 weeks, they will be destroyed.
